

Deer Safety Project

Low tech – scented virtual fence, white bags, increased visibility

Moderate tech – *Reflectors* – *reflect car headlights*







Deer Safety Project

High tech -

- Gamewarners connect when car approaches – emit variable alarm and LEDs – work daytime
- Virtual fence triggered by headlights – sound alarm and flashing LEDs
- Alarm sensors motion activated by animal – various sounds (dogs, sticks, bees)
