More work is ongoing at the play park, as the Parish Council works to address matters that were raised during the Annual Inspection of the park. We have made arrangements with our grass cutting contractor to address some trip hazards that have been identified around various pieces of equipment and to re-turf the area of the goal mouth. In addition, a new metal basketball net will be installed at the basketball post.

In addition, we are delighted to inform residents that Lesley Badger has very kindly donated a bench to the Parish Council in memory of her husband, Lewis Henry Badger, who was a Parish Councillor for Brocton for many years. The bench will be located in the park and the work for the installation has started.

Your protection from previous doses of the vaccine may now be lower and will continue to decline.

Residents of Stafford Borough are being asked for views on future plans in Stafford.

A major consultation on a new 'Local Plan' for Stafford Borough was launched **on 24 October and will run until 12 December.** The Local Plan 2020-2040 – Preferred Options document is seeking views on draft policies and proposals for new development across Stafford Borough over the next 20 years.

The Preferred Options document includes:

1. New levels of housing and employment land requirements, and how these will be distributed across the Borough through a new settlement hierarchy;

2. Proposed development allocations including Stafford Station Gateway and a new garden community at Meecebrook near to Yarnfield, Stone and Eccleshall;

3. A range of draft planning policies on topics such as climate change, economic development, housing provision, transport and the environment.

The Parish Council has been reviewing the proposals and it would appear that the majority of housing development is in Stafford town centre and towards Stone, therefore, we do not feel that a formal response to the Consultation is required. However, if residents do not agree, please inform one of your Parish Cllrs or the Clerk, as we will be more than happy to submit comments on behalf of the Parish, if required. The closing date for comments is noon on 12 December 2022.
