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Parish Council Update

Parish Precept. During November, December 2023 and January 2024, the Parish Councillors considered the budget for the financial year 2024/25. The Councillors were keen to keep any increase to the Parish Precept as low as possible, however, they recognised the need to maintain a balanced budget, meet increased costs and deliver improvements within the Parish. Therefore, the Councillors made the decision to proceed with an increase to the Precept request for 2024/25, which will mean an increase of £1.34 per annum from last year, based upon an average Band D property.

The Council is planning to improve the fencing in the Parish play park; host community events throughout 2024/25 for the enjoyment of residents and replace the Parish Notice Board on Pool Lane. As advised in the September 2023 edition of the Paper Chase, the Council is developing a Project Plan to fund future improvements to the play park – see page 6 for more details.

Dates for 2025 will be agreed towards the end of this year.

Please don't forget: Stafford Borough Council wish all residents using the bin lorry service to be aware of the following: due to a change in legislation, we will no longer be able to accept sofas or armchairs at the 2024 Civic Amenity Visits. This is due to legislation around Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs) which are found in soft furnishings, these items cannot be crushed (as they would be in the collection vehicle) and need to be collected separately either by arrangement with Stafford Borough Council or taken to designated containers at the Household Waste Recycling Centres in Stafford and Stone.

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Information from Staffordshire County Council

Staffordshire's roads will be getting a welcome funding boost over the next few years.

Highways bosses at Staffordshire County Council have welcomed a government announcement that £8.3 billion will be invested into England's roads over the next 11 years. A total of £2.2 billion will be invested in the West and East Midlands alone, with more than £186 million coming to Staffordshire over the 11-year period.

The funding is part of the Government's Network North plan to spend the money saved by cancelling HS2 north of Birmingham.

An initial £3.188 million has been made available in-year, which is in addition to the £20 million the authority has already invested in the repair and maintenance of highways over the past 12 months. With more than 6,000km of roads, the county council has undertaken a comprehensive programme of repair and resurfacing.

This latest fund will be allocated to maintaining, repairing and improving the county's roads.

More than 16,000 pothole repair jobs have been completed this year so far.

A 'job' is, on average, two or three potholes at a time – meaning the number of potholes filled across the county is likely to be double or even triple that figure. In 2022, Staffordshire Highways filled 16,039 carriageway potholes, significantly exceeding the national Local Authority average of 11,229. With 16,308 already completed so far, this year has already

seen crews surpass their 2022 total.

2023 has also seen the county council invest in groundbreaking AI technology that identifies and categories potholes as well as innovative machinery, like the JCB Pothole Pro, to repair defects. Two million pounds from the pothole fund has enabled county councillors to prioritise non-urgent nuisance potholes reported locally.

Residents can report potholes on the county council's website, using the 'Report It' function. Repairs are then prioritised depending on the severity and dangerousness of the defect.

Information from Stafford Borough Council:

Litter louts to be hit in pocket as fines more than double for fly tipping in Stafford.

Councillors are looking to impose £1,000 fines for those dumping rubbish illegally in Stafford Borough.

Nationally, fly-tipping has been on the rise and the cost to the Borough – and its residents – of clearing it up was around £30,000 last year. As part of its Anti-social Behaviour Actions Plan, the Government wants Councils to take a tougher approach to environmental crimes and has set out new upper limits for FPN's. it means that:

- Fly Tipping FPN's increase from £400 to £1,000
- Litter and Graffiti FPN's will rise from £100 to £500
- Breach of Household Waste duty of care penalties go from £200 to £600

Many offenders claim to have paid a 'white van man' to get rid of their rubbish. But the Borough Council say residents should only use registered waste carriers or could find themselves facing punishment if rubbish is discarded illegally. People should check credentials of those offering to take rubbish https://environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/search-waste-carriers-brokers

and ask where they are going to dispose of the waste and always get a receipt.

In 2019, teams set themselves the most ambitious targets for nature in the sector and continue to work to meet them.

There is always a warm welcome at Staffordshire Libraries

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Trying to keep warm this winter? Don't make cuts to fire safety.

Advice from Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service: We are urging residents across Staffordshire to Be Warm, Be Safe this New Year, as low temperatures and high heating costs continue across the county. As the cost-of-living increases, so too does the need to heat your home cheaply. However, this can bring with it some serious dangers. And with more people looking for low-cost, unsafe ways to heat their homes this winter comes an increased likelihood of accidental house fires.

Follow these top tips to make sure you are staying warm safely and not putting your safety, or that of others at risk:

- Get chimneys swept and use a fireguard
- Keep heaters a safe distance away from other items and materials
- Store fuel, such as logs, away from the heat source
- Use appropriate fuel on open fires/in log burners. Look for the Woodsure "Ready to Burn" logo.
- Camping stoves, BBQs and outdoor heaters should only be used outdoors
- Keep a safe distance from heaters and open fires
- Ensure you have working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors
- Candles are a big fire risk, LED candles are much safer, or use a torch
- Electric heaters should be plugged into a wall socket do not use extension leads as they can easily be overloaded and cause a fire
- Run dishwashers, washers and tumble dryers when you are awake, they can cause fires and at night you'll have less time to react and escape

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Who do I call if there is a power cut? If you need to speak in an emergency, perhaps because you are experiencing a loss of power supply, you will now need to contact National Grid and you can use the following numbers: 105, from a landline or mobile or 0800 328 1111 from a landline or 0330 123 5008 from a mobile. * calls to 0330 numbers cost no more than a local rate number from a landline or mobile
