## **About the Light up the Longest Night campaign**

As part of our suicide prevention and mental wellbeing work, Staffordshire County Council's Public Health Team is working with Staffordshire Samaritans on a campaign to remind people that the Samaritans Support Line is always open, including over Christmas and New Year.

- Saturday 21 December is the longest night of the year, with the sun setting around 4.00pm
- Several buildings, including the Shire Hall Gallery in Stafford and the Screwfix HQ, will be lit up green
- Members of the public are invited to join us by displaying a light and poster in their window at home and posting a photo on social media using the hashtag #lightupthenight
- We'll be sharing public messages through Staffordshire County Council's corporate social media channels, emails to partners and media releases from Monday 2 December 2022.
- Public information about the campaign is published on our web page.

Samaritans have some great tips on how to start a conversation and encourage people to listen to the important things their friends, family and colleagues need to tell them. Remember, SHUSH.



## Show you care

Focus on the other person, make eye contact, put away your phone.



## Have patience

It may take time and several attempts before a person is ready to open up.



## Use open questions

That need more than a yes/no answer, and follow up eg 'Tell me more'.



## Say it back

To check you've understood, but don't interrupt or offer a solution.



## Have courage

Don't be put off by a negative response and, most importantly, don't feel you have to fill a silence.
